

CLAYTON COUNCIL MEETING – 101

Clayton citizens are welcomed and encouraged to attend town council meetings. Attending a council meeting allows you to be informed about the issues before the Clayton Town Council.

Since this is an election year for the Town, this issue of “Clayton Council Meeting – 101” will provide an overview of the Clayton Town Council and the duties of the Mayor and Council.

The Clayton Town Council consists of six elected officials and all serve a four-year term. The following requirement must be met in order to serve as Mayor or a Council member:

- ⇒ Resident of the Town of Clayton, meaning you physically reside in the Town of Clayton
- ⇒ 21 years of age
- ⇒ Registered voter
- ⇒ Not be convicted of a felony

Mayor Jody L. McLeod is Clayton’s first Mayor to serve a four-year term.

Some of the duties of the Mayor are:

- ⇒ Official head of the Town government
- ⇒ Presides at meetings of the Council
- ⇒ Chief spokesperson for the Town
- ⇒ Signs contracts and agreements on behalf of the Town
- ⇒ Administers oaths of office
- ⇒ Votes only to break tie vote of the Council

Mayor Pro Tem Robert J. Ahlert, Councilman Bob Satterfield, and Councilman Michael Grannis have terms of office expiring 2009. Councilman Alexander R. Atchison and Councilman Alex Harding have terms of office expiring 2007.

Some of the duties of the Council are:

- ⇒ Establishes a tax rate
- ⇒ Adopts a budget for how the Town will spend its money
- ⇒ Sets policies for municipal services
- ⇒ Passes ordinances to regulate behavior
- ⇒ Enters into contracts and agreements
- ⇒ Makes appointments to boards and committees

When a Council member serves as the Mayor Pro Tem, it means the Council elected one of its members as Mayor Pro Tem to perform the duties of the Mayor during his absence or disability. A councilman serving as the Mayor Pro Tem is entitled to vote on all matters before the Council and shall be considered a councilman for all purposes, including the determination of a quorum.
